## Man convicted of 2019 double murder outside of westside club

*Terrance Warren shot and killed Charles Reeves and William Walker during early morning shooting at club*

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind. – Marion County Prosecutor Ryan Mears announced that Terrance Warren has been convicted of two counts of Murder and Carrying a Handgun Without a License (Class A Misdemeanor) for the May 11, 2019, shooting deaths of Charles Reeves and William Walker outside of a club in the 3500 block of W. 16<sup>th</sup> Street.

After the shooting, officers located Reeves near the front of the business and Walker in the parking lot; both men were suffering from multiple gunshot wounds. The incident was captured on security footage provided by the business.

At approximately 1 a.m., there was a disturbance outside of the club. As the altercation escalated, people can be seen in the video running away and ducking. Warren can be seen shooting a handgun. Reeves is seen walking and texting in front of the building as bullets strike the pavement before he falls to the ground. Walker can be seen running towards a vehicle when he collapses. Warren fled the area after the shooting.

Detectives received an anonymous lead that “Man Man,” who was later identified as Warren, was responsible for the shooting. Information as to Warren’s whereabouts was also provided.

When presented with photos of the suspected shooter, the business’ manager was able to identify Warren by his nickname and noted that he was throwing money in the club on the night of the shooting. In an interview with investigators, Warren identified himself in a still photo from the security footage of the shooter.

A sentencing hearing is set for December 17 at 9:00 a.m. in Criminal Court 28.
