ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL

Hall Courtney, Iva Marshall Davis, Gladys Lucas Doyle, Selma Beck Harry, Ruth Haynes, Martha Horner, Fannie Hyde, Lillian LeMon, Henrietta Herod MacMillan, Edith Overton, Mercy Smith, Frances Stout, Lillian Taylor, Harriet Taylor, Murray Atkins Walls, A. Louise Moss Webb, and Lorene Cook Turner, with Mary A. Johnson, Dean of Girls as Crispus Attucks High School, serving as the chapter's first President; and

WHEREAS, throughout the years, AMO has given leadership and robust support to various national programs such as the Foreign Scholarship Fund, the Mississippi Health Project, the Sickle Cell Anemia Project, the Cleveland Job Corps, the project to purchase the birthplace of Martin Luther King, Jr. and the Educational Advancement Foundation; and

WHEREAS, in 1979, Ivy Endowment, Incorporated was established to pledge and honor AMO's commitment to supporting young women's education in Central Indiana. Education continues to be one of AMO's primary focuses. Alpha Mu Omega has also provided arts, entertainment, lectures and forums as social and educational opportunities for the local community and

Proposal No. 22, 2024 was retitled GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 1, 2024, and reads as follows:

CITY-COUNTY GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 1, 2024

A PROPOSAL FOR A GENERAL ORDINANCE to amend Chapter 431 and Chapter 441 of the Revised Code to require that the Fatal Crash Review Team review serious bodily injuries in addition to fatal crashes.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY-COUNTY COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS AND OF MARION COUNTY, INDIANA:

SECTION 1. Chapter 441 of the "Revised Code of the Consolidated City and County" regarding the Fatal Crash Review Team is hereby amended by adding the language that is underlined to read as follows:

Sec. 441-601. Review of fatal crashes; recommendations

- (a) Whenever a vehicular crash occurs within the jurisdiction of the city resulting in the death of any person, the Indianapolis Metropolitan Police Department shall initiate a review of the circumstances of the crash by the fatal crash review team after completion of the police investigation of the crash and any determination by the Marion County Prosecutor whether criminal charges will be filed in relation to the crash. By July 1, 2024, the department of public works shall establish (and report to the city-county council public works committee) a methodology and process to determine which non-fatal crashes resulting in incapacitating injuries will be reviewed by the fatal crash team. After January 1, 2025, the fatal crash review team shall review and treat vehicle crashes occurring within the jurisdiction of the city that result in serious bodily injury, as defined by this methodology and process, in the same manner as vehicle crashes resulting in the death of a person.
- (b) The fatal crash review team shall meet one (1) or more times as necessary to review all relevant information about the fatal crash to determine whether the design, the traffic controls, or other elements of the existing roadway on the streets or highways where the crash occurred could be improved in a way that will increase safety of all users of that street or highway.
- (c) At the conclusion of its review, the fatal crash review team shall make a written report to the mayor, the chief of police and the director of public works recommending roadway design changes, improved traffic controls, or other improvements or mitigation measures that the team determines are advisable and feasible to implement in order to improve the safety of all users of that street or highway where the fatal crash occurred. Written reports shall be posted to the city and county website.
- (d) The fatal crash review team shall create and post online an annual report listing all of the improvements that have been made based on their recommendations.

SECTION 2. Should any provision (section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or any other portion) of this ordinance be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid for any reason, the remaining provision or provisions shall not be affected, if and only if such remaining provisions can, without the invalid provision or provisions, be given the effect intended by the Council in adopting this ordinance. To this end the provisions of this ordinance are severable.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its passage by the Council and compliance with Ind. Code § 36-3-4-14.
