Assessment & Intervention Center



The Assessment & Intervention Center (AIC) is a first-of-its-kind facility and the flagship of Mayor Joe Hogsett's criminal justice reform efforts.

The AIC provides mental health and substance use assessments with a goal of connecting individuals to appropriate community resources.

Sandra Eskenazi Mental Health Center operates the facility and provides 24/7 programming to address mental health, addiction, homelessness and other socio-economic issues influencing an individual's overall health and well-being.

Referrals are welcomed from a variety of sources including law enforcement and corrections, homeless shelters and outreach programs, emergency departments, primary care centers, as well as self-referral.





The second floor of the facility is named the Reuben Engagement Center at the AIC in honor of the Reuben family and for their contributions for helping individuals with substance use disorders or who may be experiencing homelessness. The AIC builds on the incredible work done by the Reuben Engagement Center, created in 2017, by expanding its reach for the intended population.

The AIC is a voluntary program and services are provided free of charge.

Core services include:

- 24/7 referrals/intakes
- Assessment by a licensed mental health clinician, paramedic or nurse, and resource coordinator
- · Withdrawal management
- · Peer-led recovery groups

- Skills training
- · Daily goal development engagement
- Access and referral to treatment/needed resources
- · Warm hand-offs to referred providers
