CITY-COUNTY FISCAL ORDINANCE NO. , 2025

A FISCAL ORDINANCE amending the City-County Annual Budget for 2025 (City-County Fiscal Ordinance No. 6, 2024) by the additional appropriations listed herein for the purposes of those departments and agencies listed below.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY-COUNTY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS AND OF MARION COUNTY, INDIANA:

SECTION 1. To provide for expenditures the necessity for which has arisen since its adoption, the City-County- Annual Budget for 2025 is hereby amended by the character increases hereinafter stated for purposes of the following departments and agencies.

SECTION 2. The <u>Office of Finance and Management</u> requests additional appropriation of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) in the Consolidated County General Fund in character three, for the purpose of a facilities assessment for Duvall Work Release Center:

SECTION 3. SECTION 4. The <u>Office of the Mayor</u> requests an additional appropriation totaling six hundred thousand dollars (\$600,000) in the Consolidated County General Fund in character three, for the purpose of supporting the fall 2025 semester of Circle City Readers:

SECTION 7. In support of the additional appropriations provided in Section 6, additional supplemental income tax revenues totaling three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000) will be received and deposited in the City Rainy Day Subfund of the Consolidated County General Fund and subsequently transferred to the Consolidated County General Fund.

SECTION 8. The <u>Department of Public Works</u> requests additional appropriations totaling sixteen million two hundred thousand dollars (\$16,200,000) in the Capital Asset Lifecycle and Development Fund in character 4, two million five hundred thousand dollars (\$2,500,000) in the Transportation General Fund in characters three and four, and one million dollars (\$1,000,000) in the Stormwater General Fund in character four for the purposes of funding the capital improvement plan commitments, the snow plowing standard, construction completion of the Solid Waste Garage, fatal crash review recommendations, urban forestry preservation, and stormwater commitments for the Blue Line.

SECTION 10. In support of the additional appropriations provided in Section 8, additional supplemental income tax revenues totaling two million five hundred thousand dollars (\$2,500,000) will be received and deposited in the City Rainy Day Subfund of the Consolidated County General Fund and subsequently transferred to the Transportation General Fund.

SECTION 11. In support of the additional appropriations provided in Section 8, additional supplemental income tax revenues totaling one million dollars (\$1,000,000) will be received and deposited in the City Rainy Day Subfund of the Consolidated County General Fund and subsequently transferred to the Storm Water Management Fund.

SECTION 12. The <u>Department of Parks and Recreation</u> requests additional appropriation totaling two million dollars (\$2,000,000) in the Parks General Fund in characters three and four for purposes of funding various parks maintenance projects:

The <u>Department of Metropolitan Development</u> requests additional appropriation totaling two million five hundred thousand dollars (\$2,500,000) in the Consolidated County General Fund in character three for purposes of funding additional homeowner repair programming and an investment in cultural districts:
