Mayor Hogsett Announces Third Class of the International Leaders Academy

17 participants from 10 countries to take part in leadership program

INDIANAPOLIS – Today, Mayor Joe Hogsett, the Mayor's Office of International and Latino Affairs (OILA) and the Immigrant Welcome Center announce the third class of the International Leaders Academy.

"The International Leaders Academy is about so much more than learning the ins and out of city-county government," said Mayor Hogsett. "Each participant walks away with the understanding of how their voice and lived experience can impact Indianapolis."

The International Leaders Academy is a free leadership program aimed at empowering and connecting with immigrant Hoosiers. It was established by OILA in partnership with the Immigrant Welcome Center. The mission of the program is to teach participants about the inner workings of local government.

"More than ever, the International Leaders Academy is relevant and needed. As our immigrant neighbors face myriad challenges that threaten their safety and well-being, ILA offers pathways and solutions to training the next cadre of immigrants who are prepared to participate in civic discourse and ensure representation of our needs and values within all levels of government," said Gurinder Kaur, Chief Executive Officer of Immigrant Welcome Center. "Immigrant Welcome Center remains a steadfast partner of City of Indianapolis' Office of International and Latino Affairs in hosting ILA."
