IMPD Launches Transparency Website Featuring Interactive Dashboards

Users can now access detailed data on crime, traffic incidents, and uses of force through the department's new website

INDIANAPOLIS — Today, the Indianapolis Metropolitan Police Department (IMPD) announced the launch of the IMPD Transparency Website, a new online tool designed to give community members instant access to crime statistics and timely information impacting their neighborhoods.

“This is another step forward in our promise to be open and accessible to the community we serve,” said Chief Chris Bailey. “We want our neighbors to see the same data we use to make informed decisions and make sure our practices reflect fairness, consistency, and integrity,” he added.

Crime Dashboard:

The crime dashboard allows users to explore calls for police service and incident reports, which result from those calls. For the incident report search, you must put an address for the remaining data to load. Both calls and incidents can be filtered by date, district, and type of event.

This dashboard helps the community better understand where incidents occur and how IMPD responds, reinforcing how resources are deployed to keep neighborhoods safe.

Traffic Dashboard

The traffic dashboard provides a detailed look at traffic events and enforcement across the city through a map-based format. Users can filter data by police district or date range, including the last week, last month, or year to date.

The dashboard includes data on:

- Traffic crashes
- Traffic stops
- Traffic citations and warnings issued

It also displays demographic information related to traffic stops, including the race and sex of individuals who received a ticket or warning, as well as the race, sex, and years of service of the officer who conducted the stop. Officer demographic information is self-reported.

Professional Standards Dashboard

The professional standards dashboard provides insight into IMPD's accountability and review processes. Visitors can view a variety of information, including uses of force such as officer-involved shootings, vehicle pursuits, and foot pursuits.

The dashboard also details the types of force utilized by date. This data reflects IMPD's continued commitment to ensuring fair and appropriate policing practices.

The IMPD Transparency Website will continue to grow, with additional dashboards planned for future release. By providing easy access to data, IMPD aims to strengthen trust, transparency, and collaboration between the department and the community. Please note that the data updates daily and may change as new information comes in.

The creation of the website was made possible through the funding and support of the Indy Chamber and JPMorganChase, whose partnership highlights the shared commitment to building a safer and more informed community.

"The Indy Chamber is proud to partner with IMPD and support the launch of its public-facing transparency hub.
