**Mylik Hill sentenced to 87 years for Attempted Murder for 2022 shooting of IMPD Officer**

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind. – Marion County Prosecutor Ryan Mears announced today that Mylik Hill has been sentenced to 87 years in prison for the February 2022 shooting of IMPD Officer Thomas Mangan. In February, Hill was convicted of two counts of Attempted Murder (Level 1 Felonies), six counts of Resisting Law Enforcement (Level 6 Felonies), and Possession of a Firearm by a Serious Violent Felon (Level 4 Felony) after a three-day jury trial.

“The significant sentence announced today not only marks the end of a challenging chapter for Officer Mangan, his loved ones, and his law enforcement family but it sends a message that attacks on our law enforcement officers will not be tolerated,” Prosecutor Mears stated.

On the night of the shooting, IMPD officers responded to an accident on Woodlawn Avenue. Witnesses directed the officers to a red Buick and Hill, who was believed to be connected to the reported accident.

Hill began to flee from officers. During an exchange of gunfire near an alley on Woodlawn, Officer Mangan sustained a gunshot wound to the throat and another shot struck the police radio located on his hip.

With the assistance from the Indiana State Police, cooperation from residents, and the utilization of a drone, IMPD SWAT officers apprehended Hill in a backyard in the 900 block of Dawson Street.
