Indy DPW opens applications for Community Powered Infrastructure projects

INDIANAPOLIS -- Applications for the next round of Community Powered Infrastructure projects are now open. This open call includes opportunities within the Indianapolis Neighborhood Infrastructure Partnership (INIP), Tactical Urbanism projects, and Art in the Right-of-Way.

The Indianapolis Neighborhood Infrastructure Partnership (INIP) helps neighborhoods and the city work together to improve local infrastructure. Through this program, community-based organizations partner with the city to share project costs, with funding supporting new improvements in the public right-of-way, such as roads, sidewalks, and projects that make it safer and easier for people to get around.

Tactical Urbanism allows neighborhoods to try out simple, low-cost changes that can make streets safer and easier to use. The community will work with the City to develop a hypothesis and collect data both pre- and post-project implementation to see whether these proposed changes would be effective solutions to the issues they are facing

Art in the Right-of-Way invites artists and community members to bring creative, meaningful artwork into public streets and sidewalks to help calm traffic and make public spaces feel more welcoming and connected.

Each year, these programs help neighbors bring their ideas to life and we rely

on residents and community groups to tell us what matters most in their neighborhoods. We encourage neighborhood associations, community organizations, and local partners to apply.
