



## **Indianapolis Metropolitan Police Department Officer Charged with Battery**

**INDIANAPOLIS** – On Saturday, February 21, 2026, officers with the Indianapolis Metropolitan Police Department (IMPD) responded to a report of a fight inside a business in the 6100 block of North Keystone Avenue. When officers arrived, they learned two adult males had been involved in a physical altercation. One of those males was identified as 7-year IMPD Officer Taylor Jones. He was off duty at the time of this incident.

Once responding officers learned Jones was involved, the IMPD Special Investigations Unit (SIU) was requested and responded to the scene to further the investigation. SIU investigators spoke to everyone involved as well as several witnesses. Both Jones and the other male had injuries that were documented by an evidence technician.

That same day, Jones was moved to an administrative duty status.

At the conclusion of their investigation, IMPD detectives presented the case to the Marion County Prosecutor's Office (MCPO) for a charging decision.

Today, on March 13, 2026, the Marion Superior Court D18 issued an arrest warrant for Jones with the charge of battery resulting in moderate bodily injury, a level 6 felony. That same day, he surrendered and was taken into custody by the IMPD Violent Crimes Unit.

IMPD has collected all of his department-issued equipment, and Jones has been suspended without pay pending termination. At this time, he does not have any police powers.

As with any person charged with a criminal offense, Jones is presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty in a court of law.
