MONDAY, APRIL 3, 2023**

The City-County Council of Indianapolis, Marion County, Indiana and the Indianapolis Police Special Service District Council, Indianapolis Fire Special Service District Council and Indianapolis Solid Waste Collection Special Service District Council convened in regular concurrent sessions, in the Council Chamber of the City-County Building at 7:13 p.m. on Monday, April 3, 2023 with Councillor Osili presiding.

A GENERAL RESOLUTION of the City-County Council of the City of Indianapolis and of Marion County, Indiana, approving (i) a Declaratory Resolution and Redevelopment Plan of the Metropolitan Development Commission of Marion County, Indiana, acting as the Redevelopment Commission of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana (the

“Commission”) and (ii) the determination of the Commission that an area within the City of Indianapolis, Indiana is an allocation area within an economic development area.

WHEREAS, on December 7, 2022, the Metropolitan Development Commission of Marion County, Indiana, acting as the Redevelopment Commission of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana (the “Commission”), being the governing body of the Redevelopment District, adopted a declaratory resolution No. 2022-E-052 (the “Declaratory Resolution”) initially approving a Redevelopment Plan (the “Plan”) for the North Meridian Economic Development Area (the “Area”) and declaring that a portion of the Area be designated as an allocation area (the “Allocation Area”) pursuant to Indiana Code § 36-7-15.1, as amended (the “Act”); and

WHEREAS, the Act requires approval of the Declaratory Resolution, the Plan and the establishment of the Allocation Area by the City-County Council of the City of Indianapolis and of Marion County, Indiana (the “Council”); and

WHEREAS, the Declaratory Resolution and Plan have been submitted to this Council; now, therefore:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY-COUNTY COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS AND OF MARION COUNTY, INDIANA:

SECTION 1. The Declaratory Resolution and Plan for the Area are in all respects approved, ratified and confirmed by the Council.

SECTION 2. The determination of the Commission that the portion of the Area described in the Declaratory Resolution is an allocation area pursuant to the Act is in all respects approved, ratified and confirmed by the Council.

SECTION 3. This resolution shall be in full force and effect upon adoption and compliance with Indiana Code §§ 36-3-4-14, 36-3-4-15 and 36-3-4-16.

CITY-COUNTY GENERAL RESOLUTION NO. 12, 2023

A GENERAL RESOLUTION of the City-County Council of the City of Indianapolis and of Marion County, Indiana, approving (i) an amending Declaratory Resolution and Redevelopment Plan, as amended, of the Metropolitan Development Commission of Marion County, Indiana, acting as the Redevelopment Commission of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana (the “Commission”) and (ii) the determination of the Commission that an area within the City of Indianapolis, Indiana is an allocation area within an economic development area.

WHEREAS, on March 6, 2019, Metropolitan Development Commission of Marion County, Indiana, acting as the Redevelopment Commission of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana (the “Commission”), being the governing body of the Redevelopment District, adopted its Resolution No. 2019-E-005 (the “Original Declaratory Resolution”) which declared an area of the City an economic development area known as the “Brookville Road/Irvington Plaza Economic Development Area” (the “Original Area”), and approved a development plan for the Original Area (the “Original Plan”) pursuant to Indiana Code § 36-7-15.1, as amended (the “Act”); and

WHEREAS, following approval by the City-County Council of the City and Marion County, Indiana (the "City-County Council"), and after holding a public hearing, all in accordance with the Act, the Commission adopted its Resolution No. 2019-E-033 on June 5, 2019, confirming the Original Declaratory Resolution; and

WHEREAS, on December 7, 2022, the Commission adopted an amending declaratory resolution No. 2022-E-053 (the "Amending Declaratory Resolution") initially approving an amendment to the Original Plan (the "Plan Amendment") for the Area (as defined herein) pursuant to the Act; and

WHEREAS, the Amending Declaratory Resolution enlarges the Original area to include certain additional parcels more particularly described therein (the "Enlarged Area", together with the Original Area, the "Area") and establishes a separate tax increment allocation area designated as the Irvington-Brookville Road Allocation Area, as more particularly described in the Amending Declaratory Resolution and the Original Plan, as amended by the Plan Amendment; and

WHEREAS, the Act requires approval of the Declaratory Resolution, the Plan and the establishment of the Allocation Area by the City-County Council of the City of Indianapolis and of Marion County, Indiana (the "Council"); and

WHEREAS, the Declaratory Resolution and Plan have been submitted to this Council; now, therefore:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY-COUNTY COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS AND OF MARION COUNTY, INDIANA:

SECTION 1. The Amending Declaratory Resolution and Original Plan for the Area, as amended by the Plan Amendment, are in all respects approved, ratified and confirmed by the City-County Council.

SECTION 2. The determination of the Commission that the portion of the Area described in the Declaratory Resolution is an allocation area pursuant to the Act is in all respects approved, ratified and confirmed by the Council.

SECTION 3. This resolution shall be in full force and effect upon adoption and compliance with Indiana Code §§ 36-3-4-14, 36-3-4-15 and 36-3-4-16.

PROPOSAL FOR A GENERAL ORDINANCE to amend the Revised Code to extend the age of taxicab model years.

- (6) Have affixed to both sides and the rear of the vehicle the license administrator's license number for the taxicab in a format prescribed by the license administrator, designed to be readable by potential customers.

All local streets within *Waterwood at Eagle Creek* platted subdivision, 25 mph;

Those rights, liabilities, and proceedings are continued, and penalties shall be imposed and enforced under the repealed or amended ordinance as if this ordinance had not been adopted.

SECTION 3. Should any provision (section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or any other portion) of this ordinance be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid for any reason, the remaining provision or provisions shall not be affected, if and only if such remaining provisions can, without the invalid provision or provisions, be given the effect intended by the Council in adopting this ordinance. To this end the provisions of this ordinance are severable.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its passage by the Council and compliance with Ind. Code § 36-3-4-14.

PROPOSAL NO. 85, 2023. The proposal, sponsored by Councillors Osili, Jones and Adamson, amends the Code to make various modifications to parking meter restrictions due to planned infrastructure improvements and economic development projects (Districts 11, 16, 17). By an 11-0 vote, the committee reported the proposal to the full Council with the recommendation that it do pass. Councillor Adamson moved, seconded by Councillor Jones, for adoption. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY-COUNTY COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS AND OF MARION COUNTY, INDIANA:

SECTION 1. That the Revised Code of the Consolidated City and County, Indianapolis/Marion County, Indiana, specifically Sec. 621-108 (e), Manner of Parking, be, and the same is hereby amended by the addition of the following, to wit:

Vermont Street, on the south side, from Meridian Street to Pennsylvania Street;

SECTION 2. That the Revised Code of the Consolidated City and County, Indianapolis/Marion County, Indiana, specifically Sec. 621-122, Stopping, standing or parking prohibited at all times on certain designated streets, be, and the same is hereby amended by the deletion of the following, to wit:

East Street, on the east side, from a point 410 feet south of Pearl Street to Ohio Street;

Illinois Street, on the west side, from McCarty Street to Louisiana Street;

Illinois Street, on the east side, from Louisiana Street to Jackson Place, North Drive;

Illinois Street, on the east side, from a point 86 feet south of South Street to a point 173 feet north of South Street;

Illinois Street, on the east side, from a point 86 feet south of South Street to South Street;

Illinois Street, on the east side, from a point 218 feet north of Henry Street to South Street;

Meridian Street, on the west side, from South Street to Washington Street;

Ohio Street, on the north side, from Delaware Street to Illinois Street;

Ohio Street, on the south side, from Illinois Street to Meridian Street;

Pennsylvania Street, on the east side, from Consec Court to Madison Avenue;

Pennsylvania Street, on the east side, from South Street to Madison Avenue;

Washington Street, on the north side, from Pennsylvania Street to Illinois Street;

SECTION 3. That the Revised Code of the Consolidated City and County, Indianapolis/Marion County, Indiana, specifically Sec. 621-122, Stopping, standing or parking prohibited at all times on certain designated streets, be, and the same is hereby amended by the addition of the following, to wit:

East Street, on the east side, from a point 410 feet south of Pearl Street to Washington Street;

East Street, on the east side, from Market Street to New York Street;

Illinois Street, on the east side, from a point 218 feet north of Henry Street to Jackson Place;

Illinois Street, on the west side, from McCarty Street to Georgia Street;

Maryland Street, on the south side, from Pennsylvania Street to Delaware Street;

Meridian Street, on the west side, from South Street to Jackson Place;

Ohio Street, on the north side, from Delaware Street to Meridian Street;

Pennsylvania Street, on the east side, from Maryland Street to Madison Avenue;

SECTION 4. Pursuant to Rev. Code Sec. 621-201 (a), four parking meter zones are established in the city of Indianapolis, designated as Parking Meter Zone 1, Parking Meter Zone 2, Parking Meter Zone 3 and Parking Meter Zone 4. Pursuant to Rev. Code Sec. 621-201 (b) parking meters may be installed in Parking Meter Zone 3 only if the City-County Council approves the installation.

SECTION 5. The Council hereby approves the installation of parking meters on the following streets, portions of streets and public rights-of-way in Parking Meter Zone 3:

St. Clair Street, on the south side, from Park Avenue (south leg) to College Avenue

SECTION 6. That the Revised Code of the Consolidated City and County, Indianapolis/Marion County, Indiana, specifically Sec. 621-402 (c), Bus stop and trolley stop zones, be, and the same is hereby amended by the deletion of the following, to wit:

Delaware Street, on the east side, from Market Street to point 120 feet north of Market Street;

Delaware Street, on the east side, from a point one hundred seventy-five (175) feet south of Michigan Street to Michigan Street;

SECTION 7. That the Revised Code of the Consolidated City and County, Indianapolis/Marion County, Indiana, specifically Sec. 621-402 (c), Bus stop and trolley stop zones, be, and the same is hereby amended by the addition of the following, to wit:

Alabama Street, on the west side, from a point 167' north of New York Street to New York Street;

Alabama Street, on the west side, from a point 185' south of North Street to North Street;

Vermont Street, on the north side, from a point 80' west of Muskingum Street to Muskingum Street;

Vermont Street, on the south side, from a point 100' east of Capital Avenue to Capital Avenue;

SECTION 8. The expressed or implied repeal or amendment by this ordinance of any other ordinance or part of any other ordinance does not affect any rights or liabilities accrued, penalties incurred, or proceedings begun prior to the effective date of this ordinance. Those rights, liabilities, and proceedings are continued, and penalties shall be imposed and enforced under the repealed or amended ordinance as if this ordinance had not been adopted.

SECTION 9. Should any provision (section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or any other portion) of this ordinance be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid for any reason, the remaining provision or provisions shall not be affected, if and only if such remaining provisions can, without the invalid provision or provisions, be given the effect intended by the Council in adopting this ordinance.
